

## Year 9 History Homework Menu Term 2

Choose something from this menu each fortnight to complete for your History homework. There are more options here than you need to do so that you have some choice. By Easter you should have completed 6 home works. Students with a target level of 2 or below can choose any of the options, those with a target level of 3 or 4 must choose at least one option from the top row and those with a target level of 5 or above must choose two of the options on the top row.

Write a newspaper article about the Death of Emily Davidson.

Research the information from the internet about the event, the main people involved and outcomes.

Create a cartoon strip showing how women were treated in prison after being arrested as a Suffragette. Include routines, treatment of the women, protests in prison and attitudes to these women.

Research Women's Suffrage from a different country to the UK. For example, the USA, France, Australia.

Design a board game to teach other students about Women's Suffrage. You do not have to make the game, but show how it would look, the instructions and rules, ideas for counters etc.

Write a report about the two suffrage movements in the UK for the Government of the time. Research the main people, events and speeches of the time and include them in your report.

Design a commemorative item, such as a flag, plate or tile to celebrate the centenary of women gaining the vote in 1918.

Write a biography about a famous campaigner for Women's Suffrage. For example, Emmeline Pankhurst, Millicent Fawcett, Elizabeth Cady Stanton or Susan B Anthony.

Re-write a well known nursery rhyme or song so that it is about women's suffrage. What do they want? Who is asking for it?

Create a rap about the Cat and Mouse Act of 1913. Research where it happened? Why it happened and who was involved. Include it all in your rap.

Evaluate a range of methods used by the Suffragettes to try to gain the vote. Compare them to the methods used by the Suffragists. Who's do you think would be the most effective and why?

Find out about women's right to vote today in 2018. Can all women vote equally with men all around the world? Use a map to help you present this research.

Are women in Britain equal with men today in all aspects of life? Do some research and present your findings. . You can present this as you wish.
