



Despite being incredibly successful in the 1870s and making many people a lot of money, the Open Range system was hit by a number of problems that ultimately brought it to an end by the end of the 1880s.










Changes in the Cattle Industry: The End of the Open Range

After the Great Die Up, smaller ranches became the model for cattle farming, they were better able to cope with the problems
