Other useful people to know

At Westfield there are lots of people here to support you.

You will be part of:

- a form group,
- a year group,
- and a hall.

You will start most mornings with your form group. This is a chance for your form tutor to talk to your form about any important news, and to check how you are doing.

Once a week you will have an assembly with your year group. This is a chance for Mr Birkbeck and his team to talk to you.

Every student in the school is a member of one of our four Halls, each named after a local river: **Don (red)**; **Loxley (blue)**; **Rivelin (yellow)**; **Sheaf (green)**. Our school logo reflects the colours of the four Halls. Students wear a tie that contains the colour of their Hall. They are allocated into a Hall when they first join the school and stay within that Hall until they leave school in Year 11.

Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) and Inclusion

It is our aim here at Westfield to promote a policy of inclusion and integration for all of our incoming Year 7 students. All students on the SEND register have a detailed learning support profile, which is shared with the student's teachers to ensure quality-first teaching supports their additional needs.

There is a wide range of staff in the school who are here to support students with their learning, behaviour and welfare.

Long term specialised provision

A few students receive long term provision because of their specialised needs. They require the skills of a specialist teacher or group of professionals to be involved. The majority of these students' time is spent in the mainstream classroom, but their 'additional and different' provision is highly personalised and closely monitored. The class teachers are clear how to encourage independence and boost these students' self-esteem.

Specific, time-limited provision

Some students receive additional SEND provision from well trained, highly effective staff. This is specific, time limited, evidence-based intervention for students who are not making good progress due to a special educational need. This includes reading, spelling, numeracy, speech and language, social emotional well-being and social skills work for students with ASD.

SEN transition events

Some students identified by their current school, are invited to participate in additional transition visits/meetings. These will help students become more familiar with the school and key staff. These additional transition visits include a range of learning activities and an experience of the school at social time. These visits are delivered by key learning support staff and supported by staff from the child's primary school.

Uniform

We are very proud of our school uniform, which was inspired by ideas from our students. Our ties reflect the Hall that a student is in. There is a different coloured tie for each Hall. Students can wear either our blazer or v-neck jumper – both of which have the school logo on them.

Transition days

Tuesday 12 and Wednesday 13 July 2022.

All incoming Year 7 students will spend two days at Westfield School.

On these days Year 6 students usually experience a variety of taster lessons, meet staff and students, and get to know the building. This is a vital part of the transition process and will help our new students get excited about starting at Westfield.

On the first day students should arrive at school by 8:40am and gather in the Main Hall where they will be met by the transition team.

In order to be prepared for the day students should:

- Bring a pen, pencil and ruler.
- Wear their primary school uniform.
- Wear footwear that is suitable for PE activities.
- Bring a packed lunch or about £3.00 to spend in the restaurant.
- Students entitled to Free School Meals will receive their usual meal allowance on the day.



Communication

We know how hard it can be for parents when their children start at secondary school. That's why we work hard to ensure you receive regular and clear communications from school.

This is a parental communications app we use to send you direct messages. It also has the school calendar plus other key documents such as student reports, as well as a newsfeed. It provides information about your child, such as their attendance, behaviour, timetable and teachers. **We strongly**

recommend that you use this app, as we can instantly send you important messages, such as information about school closures. We will provide further information about how to use it at the Welcome Evening.

Newsletters

We send out an electronic newsletter every week or so, with a message from the Headteacher and news of students' achievements. It contains important updates so please ensure we have your up to date email address.

Subjects

Studying at secondary school is very different from primary school. Students will be taught by a range of subject-specialist teachers and will have lessons in classrooms across the school, which are specially equipped for the needs of each department. These include the science laboratories, drama and dance



studios, swimming pool, gym, and the design and technology rooms.

Students in Year 7 will study a wide range of subjects including English, maths, science, history, languages, geography, RE, PSHE, art, design & technology, PE, drama, music, and ICT.

Reading

Westfield is a reading school where everyone encourages, supports, shares and celebrates the joy of reading for pleasure. We love that books can teach you important new knowledge, take you on wild and wonderful journeys to different places and times, and also get you to consider and debate interesting



ideas. During your time at Westfield you will be set regular reading challenges, will be supported to log reading in your planners, and become amazing authors yourselves. In lessons we will share reading recommendations for new and exciting books and you will be able to continue to develop your reading and love of books during your regular reading lessons which take place in our fantastic library.

Numeracy

Numeracy is a proficiency which is developed mainly in Mathematics but also in many other subjects. It is more than an ability to do basic arithmetic; it involves developing confidence and competence with numbers and

measures. It requires a solid understanding of the number system and a repertoire of other mathematical techniques. Westfield School is committed to raising the standards of numeracy of all of its students, so that they develop the ability to use numeracy skills effectively in all areas of the curriculum and the skills necessary to cope confidently with the demands of further education, employment and adult life. We are designing our curriculum to ensure that all students benefit from the increased social mobility that materialises when one is confidently numerate.
