Two years ago, Westfield officially joined Chorus Education Trust, a small multi-academy trust that was founded by Silverdale School, an Ofsted-rated 'Outstanding' school in Sheffield.

The Chorus ethos is 'Outstanding Achievement for All' which means that we are committed to helping every student achieve beyond expectations. By joining Chorus, we have gained extra resources and expertise. Already, our staff are benefitting by working with colleagues at other schools. Chorus also runs one of the largest Teaching Schools in the region, providing us with access to additional, excellent training and resources for our staff.

With the weight of Chorus behind us, we are able to attract some of the very best teachers in the city. Already we have gained Assistant Headteachers for Maths and English, who have track records of helping students achieve the highest results in Sheffield.

Our students also gain priority access to Silverdale Sixth Form, which regularly achieves the highest A-level results in Sheffield.

Being part of Chorus has given our staff access to support, expertise and resources that have made a real difference in the classroom.

A strong focus on excellence in teaching and learning

We believe that having the best teachers in the classroom is key to our students' success, so we have continued to recruit subject specialist teachers who bring a wealth of knowledge and experience.

All of our teachers are trained to respond to the different needs of our students, providing appropriate levels of work that also stretch them to achieve beyond expectations.

We have brought in several initiatives to promote academic excellence, including making English and Maths a key part of tutor time for Year 11 students and providing an extra 'period 6' lesson for Year 11 students after school. In 2019, over 30 of our high-ability mathematicians opted into the Level 2 Further Maths qualification, with 84% achieving a C grade or better.

Current educational research around the theme of 'Responsive Teaching' underpins both the curriculum and the teaching that takes place every day. Teachers

at Westfield put their students at the centre of everything they do, planning learning activities which enable personalised learning, leading to outstanding achievement for all.


Raising aspirations

We want our students to have lots of options when they leave Westfield, so they can live interesting, productive and rewarding lives.

So our job is twofold: to ensure that they don't set limits on their ambition and that they then achieve what they need to get there.

We recently reviewed our curriculum to increase the academic challenge and have set new targets for all students that encourage them to achieve well in excess of national expectations.

We work with local universities and employers to open our students' minds to the different opportunities available to them. We also provide a range of extra-curricular activities to broaden their skill base and experiences — and to support their applications to future careers and further/higher education pathways.



Modern facilities

We are fortunate enough to have a bright, modern building that also provides sports facilities for the local community.

We have a heated, indoor pool and modern gym, as well as two sports halls and numerous outside pitches. Our PE department has been voted the best in Sheffield and runs all kinds of sporting clubs and teams.

We have a number of computer suites, fully equipped science labs, design and technology classrooms for woodwork, catering, textiles, product design and engineering, a drama studio, art studios and a new library. Every student can hire a locker. We have a staggered lunchbreak so that students can easily access the on-site catering facilities.

A friendly and supportive school – with clear expectations

One of the big changes we have made in recent times is the introduction of 'Positive Discipline'. We know that the vast majority of our students have the right attitude to learning and so we recognise and reward them for consistently doing the right thing.

We also know that school should be a safe, calm place where our students can focus on their learning. So we support them to ensure they are prepared every day — dealing with any issues before they even get to the classroom, to ensure that lessons are free from distractions.

When students do need help they have the support of our specialist, pastoral staff for each year group, along with form tutors. We also work hard to stay in touch with parents, sending regular newsletters and also providing up to date information via our communications app about your child's timetable, behaviour and rewards.
