## Impact of the strategy

Grade 9-4 attainment in English improved from the 2017/18 results	Exam analysis shows grade 9-4 in English rose by 7.1% for students for whom the school receives the Pupil Premium.
Grade 9-5 attainment in English improved from the 2017/18 results	Exam analysis shows grade 9-5 in English rose by 6.9% for students for whom the school receives the Pupil Premium.
Grade 9-4 attainment in Science improved from 2017/18 results	Exam analysis shows grade 9-4 in Science rose by 6.6% for students for whom the school receives the Pupil Premium.
Grade 9-4 attainment in Humanities improved from 2017/18 results	Exam analysis shows grade 9-4 in Humanities rose by 13.8% for students for whom the school receives the Pupil Premium.
Grade 9-5 attainment in Humanities improved from 2017/18 results	Exam analysis shows grade 9-5 in Humanities rose by 10.8% for students for whom the school receives the Pupil Premium.
Accelerated improvement in reading age	The increase in chronological reading age for students for whom we are in receipt of the Pupil premium was 2 months higher on average than for other students.
Attendance of students for whom we are in receipt of the Pupil Premium increased from the previous year.	0.4% increase for students who have received free school meals in the past 6 years. The measure now calculated for students for whom we receive the Pupil Premium shows a 1.2% rise of the figure.
Inclusion	The school did not permanently exclude any students for whom we are in receipt of the Pupil Premium in 2018/19.
More parents and carers of pupils for whom we are in receipt of the Pupil Premium engaged with the schools programme of parents' evenings	Attendance of students monitored and evaluated after each event.
